5. Secretary's Report

A copy of the Secretary's report was circulated at the meeting.

Steve reported that there had not been any real major issues during the season, with all matches finished by the mid-October deadline. He congratulated the clubs in getting the matches played as the weather had been particularly bad during the Mixed League season and there were still many matches to be played when the Men's and Ladies leagues commenced.

During the season there had been a number of conceded matches, 6 in the Mixed, 10 in the Men's and 4 in the Ladies. In the Men's, Oakham had conceded 3 of their matches in the 1st Division and Huntingdon "B" 3 in the 2nd Division. There had only been 1 conceded match in Ladies 4, which had 9 teams taking part, which was commendable. Generally most of the matches were conceded in the higher divisions, with the lower divisions playing nearly all their fixtures. It would appear some team captains in the higher divisions were willing to concede matches when they were unable to field their strongest team, which is disappointing.

Due to the number of teams entering this season, it had been necessary to place 9 teams in both Mixed 5 and Ladies 4. This increased the number of matches in these divisions, resulting in an extended season for the teams in these divisions. Team captains in these divisions should be congratulated in getting all the matches played. Unfortunately, a number of clubs withdrew teams previously entered into the Men's league, which resulted in Men's 4 and Men's 5 only having 7 and 6 teams in them respectively. This reduced the number of matches in both divisions, but there was no other option.

Steve commented that he had received notification that Oakham were withdrawing their Men's team next season. This would result in a number of teams throughout the Men's league having to be promoted, even though they did not finish in the top two positions in their division. This could also result in problems in the lower divisions, reducing the number of teams in these unless additional teams are entered.

There had not been any complaints during the season regarding imbalance of home and away fixtures, so hopefully a better job had been made of arranging the fixtures. As a number of clubs enter more teams than the match nights when they can host home fixtures, there is little that can be done other than move some home matches to away matches for some of their teams. Where possible, a vice versa situation is tried to be arranged for these teams against promoted or relegated teams to provide a reasonable balance of home and away matches. This avoids the team having to play two years in succession away or at home against the same team.

Steve congratulated Virgin Active Thorpe Wood for winning Mixed 1, which prevented Stamford from having a clean sweep of all three leagues, having won both the Men's and Ladies leagues. He congratulated Stamford for this achievement and for also winning both the Don Brace Cup and also a share of the Top Club Trophy. He also congratulated all the other divisional winners and runners up for their success during the season.

Unfortunately, an error had been made when the Top Club Trophy details had been sent out with the AGM paperwork. Deeping had been omitted from the list of teams by accident, which was unfortunate as they had actually won 35 points, the same number as Stamford, who had been listed as the winning club. As both clubs finished on equal points, this is the first season the Trophy has been shared. Congratulations to both clubs for the success of all their teams. There were also joint runners up in 2nd place, with Chatteris and Virgin Active Thorpe Wood finishing on 29 points.

Steve stated that the website continued to be the main source of providing information to member clubs. The electronic score entry system continues to work well and it had not been necessary for clubs to send in confirmation of scores by post. Steve mentioned that whilst on holiday he was unable to access submitted scorecards and ended up having to delete the website from the server. This took 48 hours to rectify, uploading the website again so that scorecards were accessible. Hopefully this did not present too many problems for clubs.

Steve concluded his report by thanking Kath for keeping him on his toes during the season. He also thanked Geoff, who continued to provide support and help, regularly communicating with him during the season. He also thanked Brian, who as Treasurer keeps track of our finances and also committee members, Dennis Vincent and Esmond Edwards, who joined the committee this season.

Finally, thanks were given to all club fixture secretaries and team captains for their work during the season, ensuring all fixtures were played. Their work is very much appreciated and ensures the league runs without too many problems.

Kath thanked Steve for his report and for his work during the season.

6. Assistant Secretary's Report

Geoff Smith produced his customary graphic presentation for circulation at the meeting. He commented he had been unable to include photos from last season's AGM due to his absence, but this year included photos taken during the Don Brace Cup Final.

He stated that in his role as Assistant League Secretary his main purpose was to provide support to Steve and help in any way possible during the season. This season, with the availability of the new

indoor and outdoor facilities at Peterborough City, he had been able to arrange the hosting of the Don Brace Cup final to coincide with the official opening of the new club facilities. The day had gone exceptionally well and everyone attending had an enjoyable experience playing on the indoor courts.

His responsibilities also included obtaining the trophies and certificate frames for presentation at the AGM to winning clubs and he hoped that clubs would display the certificates in their clubhouse to promote the clubs' success.

Finally, Geoff thanked Kath, Steve and the other committee members for their hard work during the season.

7. Treasurer's Report

Brian Brown circulated the accounts of the Association.

During the year income totalled £1,430, slightly higher than the previous season, with expenditure amounting to £1,237 a surplus of £193. At the end of the year reserves stood at £3,886.

Brian stated that during the season the main items of expenditure other than the League Secretary's honorarium and league running expenses were hosting of the Don Brace Cup Finals at City of Peterborough Tennis Club, which amounted to £150, slightly cheaper than the previous year. Trophies and engraving had cost 196 and Committee travel £208.

At the last Committee meeting it was agreed that there was no requirement to increase the league entry fees in 2017. The following rates were also agreed for costs relating to the Committee members, these are unchanged:

Travel costs - Reimbursed at 50p per mile
Meeting Hosting Fee - £10
Refreshment Allowance - £5

Brian thanked Esmond Edwards for once again inspecting the accounts at the end of the year.

The Chairwoman thanked Brian for his financial report and asked for a proposal that this be accepted.

8. Don Brace Cup

Kath stated that it had been a very successful year for the Don Brace competition as matches were played, almost all on time, and with no hiccups. As only 11 teams entered it had been decided by the Committee not to run a Plate competition as this would end up with too few matches being played and not seeming like a real competition. If more clubs enter in the future then the Plate competition could be reintroduced, if clubs wanted this. However, it was clear from last season that it was not a high priority for clubs.

Kath explained that there had been a change of venue for the Final. The Committee had received an invitation from City of Peterborough to host the Final and that this had been accepted as part of the launch of their new facilities.

In the Final, Stamford defeated Action Virgin Thorpe Wood 7 - 1. Unfortunately, during the Final one of the Thorpe Wood male players sustained a leg injury during the Mixed match and as a result had had to concede two of their matches. A substitute player had been found to play in the remaining matches to give the other players some competition, but obviously the score in these matches could not count. The other matches were hard fought, not really reflecting the competitiveness. After the matches concluded the players were provided refreshments in the club house, organised by the City of Peterborough club.

Kath commented that setting fixed weekends for each round of the competition had proved to be very successful, the first year this had been tried. This resulted in all the clubs organising their fixtures in good time and all getting played.

Kath also commented that apart for the player who had been injured, the Final had been a good afternoon of tennis. She thanked Peterborough City for inviting us over to celebrate the long-awaited opening of their new indoor and outdoor facilities and hopefully next season more clubs would enter the competition.

9. Presentation of Trophies

Kath presented trophies to this season's divisional and Don Brace Cup and Plate winners.

12. Any other Business

Jim Wheeler asked about the scheduled weekend dates set down for the Don Brace Cup rounds. It was agreed that the matches should either take place on the set weekend or could be arranged earlier if both clubs were willing to do this. If there was bad weather on the set weekend, then the matches should be arranged on a weekend as close to the set date as possible.

A long discussion took place with regard to the start time of league matches. Clubs were still experiencing problems arriving at clubs where a start could not be made at the time scheduled. Steve stated that if clubs requesting a start time of 7.00 p.m. were only making this the time the warm up could start, then this concession would be removed at that club. The normal start time for evening matches was 6.30 p.m. Those clubs who ran junior coaching and requested a later start time of 7.00 p.m. must accept this is the start time of the match, not the time the court will be made available. The junior coaching should vacate the court no later than 6.50 p.m. If the visiting club is prepared to start later, then a later start may be acceptable, but this needs establishing prior to the day of the match. Some clubs have to travel considerable distance to away matches and late starts result in them arriving home at a very late time, which can present some players difficulty if they have to start work early the following morning. It is also a major concern for clubs who play juniors in their teams, for them to return home at a late hour is unacceptable and clubs need to take this into consideration.

LEAGUE SECRETARY'S REPORT **for the** **ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING - 2017**

This season continued the trend of recent years, with really no major issues presenting themselves. Clubs should be congratulated for organising their league and Don Brace Cup fixtures and any rescheduled matches due to weather cancellations without fuss during the season. It is really pleasing to say that only 4 matches were conceded in each of our 3 leagues, the least number ever as far as I can establish. In the Ladies league, 3 of the conceded matches were by the same team. Regretfully, this club was in the 1st division, our lower divisions continue to endeavour to play all their matches without captains claiming the matches or conceding. Generally, the lower division teams always try to play all their fixtures, with team captains being very co-operative when their opponents when they have difficulty fielding a team on the set date. Unfortunately, in previous seasons, this does not always have seemed to be the case in the higher divisions, with a few team captains willing to concede if they didn't get their strongest team out on the day. Fortunately, this season things do seem to have improved.

Once again, I did not receive any complaints during the season from teams about the imbalance in the number of home and away games they had been allocated. Hopefully this indicates I continued to arrange the fixtures fairly carefully!

As last season, due to the number of teams entered, it did mean both Mixed 5 and Ladies 4 divisions had 9 teams in them. This number of teams extends the season by a couple of weeks and leaves little time for rearrangements. I therefore decided to start both divisions one week earlier than the other divisions to ensure these divisions could be completed in good time. Due to team withdrawals in higher divisions, it was necessary to promote a number of teams who did not finish in the top two positions the previous season. This ensured the higher divisions had 8 teams in them, the optimum number. Unfortunately, this resulted in Men's 4 only having 7 teams and Men's 5 only 6 teams. Prior to the start of the season, Huntingdon "C" withdrew from Men's 4 and it was too late to reschedule any matches, leaving only 6 teams in the division. In Men's 5, which also had only 6 teams, Hemingfords asked if they could enter a "D" Men's team and I was able to accommodate them by rescheduling all the matches in that division increasing the number of teams in the division to 7.

Congratulations to Stamford Tennis Club who improved on last season's achievement by winning all 3 leagues 1st Divisions and also the Top Club Trophy. They were denied a clean sweep of all available competitions when they were beaten 5 - 3 in the final of the Don Brace Cup by Huntingdon. This win by Huntingdon broke the 3-year domination of the competition by Stamford, who themselves had broken Huntingdon's 7 year domination of the competition previously. Congratulations to all teams who won their respective divisions and all runners up for gaining promotion next season. Commiserations to those teams who have been relegated.

My thanks one again to Kath Marshall, who once again organised the Don Brace Cup and who will give a report on the competition during the AGM. Due to the success of last season's competition we decided to again accept City of Peterborough's invitation to host this season's competition. My thanks also to Geoff Smith who made all the arrangements at the club to ensure the final preparations were all in place to host the event. The players of Stamford and Huntingdon fully enjoyed playing the final at City and also the refreshments provided at the end of the matches.

My thanks again to Geoff Smith who continues to be ever supportive and willing to help whenever needed. As in previous season's, Geoff takes on the responsibility of organising the trophies for the AGM and once again will be the official photographer during the meeting. I cannot thank Geoff enough for all his hard work during the season. My thanks also to Kath, who ensures I am kept on my toes meeting deadlines and arranging Committee meetings. Thanks also to Brian Brown our Treasurer and to the other Committee members, Dennis Vincent and Esmond Edwards for their help and support during the year. This season we were also joined on the committee by Jason Tuxworth, who has proved to be an important addition to the Committee.

Thanks once again to Huntingdon Tennis Club who have once again allowed us the use of their clubhouse to stage our AGM.

Finally, my thanks also to the clubs, their committees, team captains and players for their efforts in making the league season during 2017 both successful and pleasantly uneventful, albeit very gratifying.

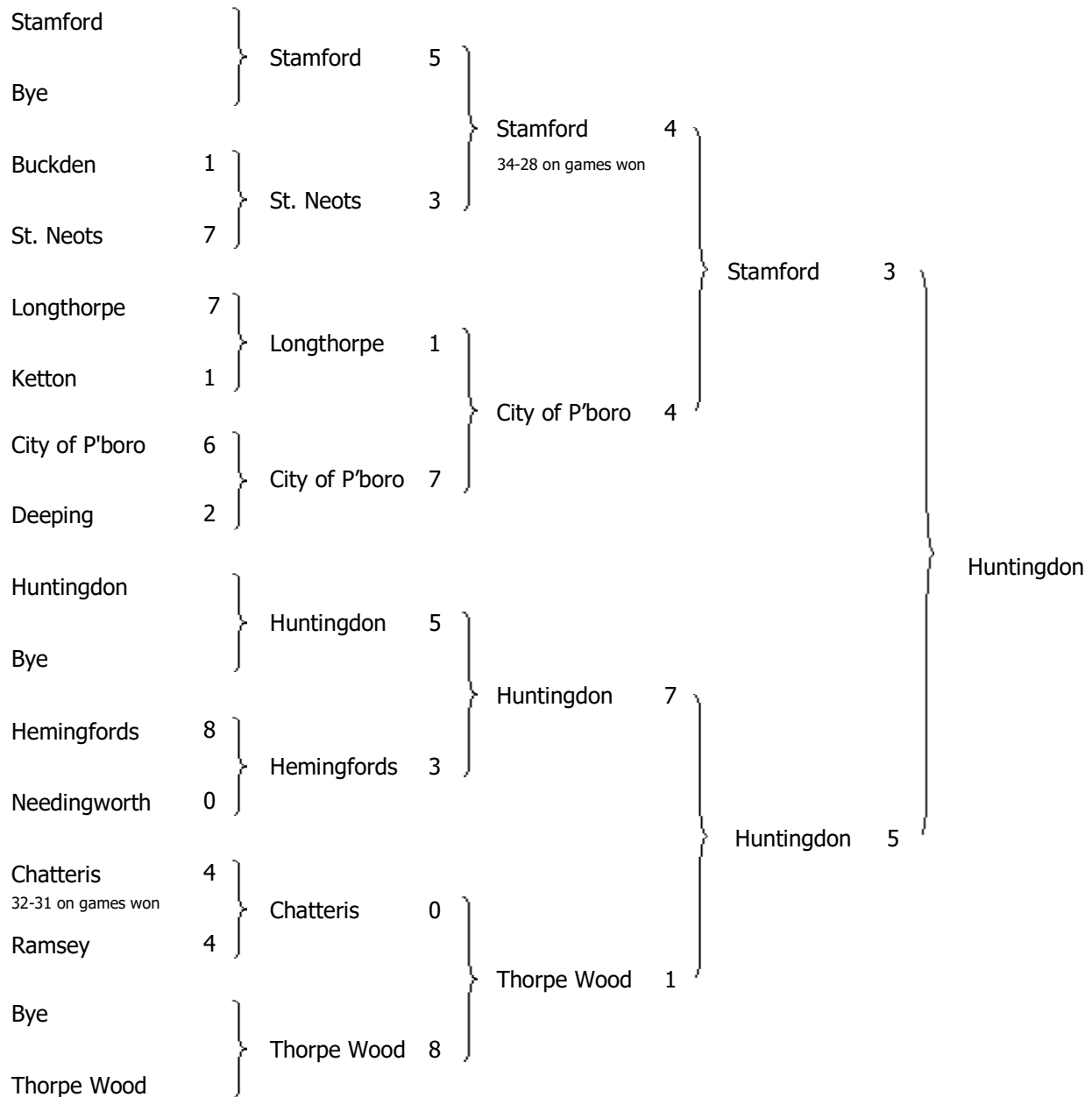
